Welcome to the final newsletter of the 2016/17 school year and what a brilliant and busy one it has been. Happy holidays to all of our families ☺



The time, energy and commitment she has given in pursuit of marathon miles has known no bounds and we are extremely grateful indeed ©



We asked Mrs Barker if she would summarize the Golden Mile in a few words and this is what she said...

'When we began the Golden Mile at the beginning of term, we hoped that maybe 30 or 40 children would regularly take part, but in true Woodborough fashion, the children enthusiastically took the challenge to heart and have wowed and amazed us every day since!

We have averaged between 90-100 runners every day and have usually run over 90 miles every day, with a tremendous 125 miles clocked on the last day of the challenge! Together the children have run 2229 miles, that's the same distance as Woodborough to the island of Crete! It's been great to see mums, dads, grandads, brothers, sisters and aunties all taking part and all enjoying pushing themselves.

Well done to the 37 KS1 children who completed the Half Marathon challenge and 25 children from KS2 who completed the full marathon distance, not forgetting the many children who achieved their 10 km and half marathon medals. A particular mention should also go to Luca, Alfie, Thomas, Cody, George, Ned, Harry M and Riley S from KS 1 who just couldn't stop running and not only achieved the half marathon target but went on to run the whole 26 miles of the KS2 marathon target! Amazing!

A big thank you also goes to Mrs Kinderman, Miss Cuss and Mr Mac who gallantly stepped into the breach when Mrs Barker was in danger of being overwhelmed by the enthusiasm of the children! Your help was invaluable—thank you!

An end of year update on our progress towards Academy Status...

As we come to the end of another school year, we would like to update you on where we are with joining with other local schools to form a Multi Academy Trust or MAT. You will remember from previous correspondence that those schools involved are Lavington, Downland Special School, All Cannings, Bishops Cannings, Chirton, Rushall and Woodborough.

All schools in the group are working hard to make this MAT a reality. One significant element of what we have been doing is to make provisional appointments of executive roles for the leadership and governance of the MAT. We are delighted that Mrs Sarah Lowkis has agreed to take on the role of Chief Executive Officer. Sarah has devoted herself, with the support of all other headteachers and governors, to ensuring all schools maintain their own unique character whilst articulating a clear vision for the MAT that will ensure we all benefit from the educational opportunities that formal collaboration can bring.


You may recall that we have referred to the MAT by the working name of SARSEN. SARSEN is an old English name for stone and in our context, refers to the local stone circles of Avebury and Stonehenge. We have now extended our name to SARSEN Multi Academy Regional Trust or SMART for short.

As part of our vision we are also busy designing a teaching and learning project to help our pupils develop confident oracy skills. Please watch out in the new school year for further updates.

So overall we are moving ever closer to forming SMART. The most likely time for conversion will be early in 2018. In the meantime, if you have any questions regarding this process, or Woodborough School's role in this process please do not hesitate to talk to a member of our Governing Body.
