Building works update...

At the end of the summer term we wrote to explain that we hoped that the refurbishment of the fire damaged part of our school would be completed in time for the start of the new academic year. Unfortunately, despite the absolute best efforts of the amazing team of builders who have worked relentlessly throughout the summer holiday, the works are not quite at the stage where we can move in and immediately resume teaching and learning.

The reinstated classrooms, staffroom and resource areas have all been reconfigured and will provide far better appointed and brighter learning environments and working spaces. However, problems concerning availability of materials and delivery dates have brought slight delays and decorating, and final fixes are still being completed. At the end of last week, we made the decision to take a little more time to ensure a smooth transition into the reinstated areas—taking time to ensure IT systems are up and running, resources are sorted, new furniture has arrived, display boards installed, etc.. As such, we will take time during Term 1 to move gradually and effectively into our new spaces.

The summer newsletter also shared news of our unsuccessful Condition Improvement Fund (CiF) bid to the DfE to replace the old porta cabins (Elm, Lime and Willow classrooms) with an extension to the school building. During the summer holiday we were further disappointed to learn that our CiF appeal had also been unsuccessful. As a consequence, notice has been given to remove the temporary, newer porta cabins (Maple and Cherry classrooms) from our school site during the October half-term holiday. However, the good news is that Years 2 and 3 will be able to continue learning in those classrooms throughout Term 1 and help facilitate our steady and thorough move into the refurbished areas of school.

We will share moving-in dates in due course and are very much looking forward to arranging tours and welcoming visitors very soon.


'Woodborough School DIY SOS' - 17th and 18th September - PLEASE SAVE THE DATE AND COME AND LEND A HAND




We'd like to encourage as many parents as possible to attend—please sign up via Weduc so we know how many people to expect.

School Uniform

The children have returned to school looking very smart thank you! In order to make sure any stray belongings make their way back to their rightful owners, may we remind all parents to make sure all items are clearly labelled.

Non-specific uniform items, e.g. skirts, trousers, PE shorts, can be purchased from any uniform retailer.

The PTA organises regular second-hand uniform sales and dates are advertised.

Lost Property

Our Lost Property box can be found just inside the main front door, outside Miss Bolwell's office.

High Visbility Jackets

For a number of years, all of our pupils have been supplied with a high visibility jacket, to ensure they are able to be clearly seen when coming and going from school and also on school visits.

The jackets are supplied on a 'permanent loan' basis,

throughout the pupils' time in school and just need to be returned when the next size up is required, or when pupils leave us.

In order that we can make sure everyone has a jacket and that sizes are appropriate, we'd like to see <u>all</u> pupils wearing their jackets next week, so we are able to supply larger ones and order any additional jackets as soon as possible.

School Bus Transport

If you wish your chid(ren) to travel home on the school bus, please be sure to confirm via Weduc by 12.45 pm daily.

Medication

would parents of children new to the school let us know if your child is asthmatic and needs an inhaler during the school day. Inhalers are kept in classrooms and should be clearly labelled and regularly checked. Thank you.

Reminder In order to comply with Local Authority guidelines our administration of medication in school is very limited. Medication will not be given to any pupil without specific written consent of a parent or carer. Please refer to the 'Administration of and Storage of Medication' letter which can be downloaded from the school website.

Allergies - a small number of pupils in school may suffer extreme allergic reactions when exposed to nuts and products that contain nuts. With this in mind please remember to check that no such food items are sent into school with pupils for consumption at either break time or lunchtime.

School Meals

Our school meals are produced from our own on-site school kitchen by our own catering team.

Pupils in Oak, Sycamore and Maple classes are all entitled to Universal Infant Free School Meals and meals cost £2.30 for pupils in Y3, 4, 5 and 6.

All orders should be placed via your Weduc account. Please note that although meals can be ordered and purchased on an ad hoc basis (when the choices may be more limited), the preferred method of ordering is in advance on either a termly or weekly (£11.50) basis. Please ensure that all completed orders are accompanied by payment otherwise meals cannot be provided.
