

At Woodborough, we follow the Teach Computing units. If teachers find additional units they would like to incorporate, they are switched with a unit which contain the same skills to maintain progression and coverage of the curriculum

Computing is split into 3 different areas, Digital Literacy (DL), Computer Science (CS) and Information Technology (IT).

In Key stage 1 they should be exposed to four main elements: computing systems and network, creating media, programming and data information.

In Key stage 2 children should continue to build upon their learning and develop their sequencing and repetition in computer programming

Children should leave school being digitally literate and be able to apply their knowledge appropriately, being aware of using technology safely, responsibility and respectfully in the digital world they live in.
