Key Stage 1
Pupils will develop knowledge about the world, the United Kingdom and their locality. They will understand and use subject-specific vocabulary relating to human and physical geography and begin to use geographical skills, including first-hand observation, to enhance their locational awareness.

Key Stage 2
Pupils will extend their knowledge and understanding beyond the local area to include the United Kingdom and Europe, North and South America. This will include the location and characteristics of a range of the world's most significant human and physical features. They will continue to develop their use of subject specific vocabulary, geographical knowledge, understanding and skills to enhance their locational and place knowledge.


