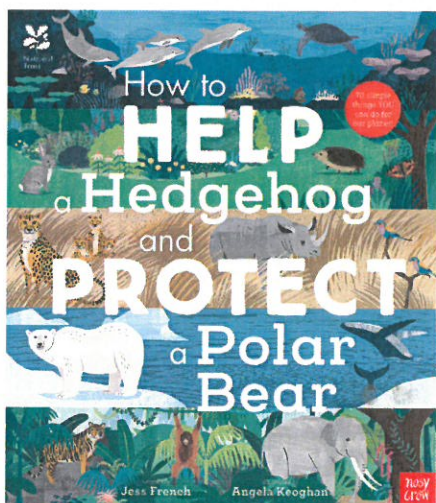


GLOBAL WEEK
