Curriculum

We are starting off Term 5 with a geography topic on North America. I was going to watch the Disney movie 'Brother Bear' with the class - as it is set in Alaska. I will be using pictures and clips from the movie to inspire *some* of the English work. If you can access the movie - give it a watch!

Math's topics that I am looking to cover:

- Measures
- Angles
- Reflections /translations

I will continue to set additional activities to cover the curriculum. These activities do not need to be completed on the day, they can be ongoing across the week.

Homework

Homework is the same as before. Children should be reading 5 times a week and continuing their daily practice with spellings and times tables.

Weekly spellings will continue to be sent out on a Monday morning and should be practiced daily alongside the activity that is being set.

It is still important in Year 5 that children read alongside adults so they can improve their fluency and confidence. Please look at the reading resources on the school website for question prompts.

Before we left we were still developing our inference skills (reading between the lines) and giving meaning to words - **in context.**
