Curriculum

This term the children will be learning about WWII in History and looking at Living Things in Science. After the February holiday, we'll be exploring Oceans along the Tropics in Geography and find out about Evolution and Adaptation in Science.

Homework

The children are expected to read at home 5 times a week. Children of this age like to read by themselves and this should be encouraged as it builds reading stamina and allows them to tackle longer, more detailed books. However, it is also important that they read to an adult as it will enable them to discuss plot development, characterisation and improve comprehension skills.

Homework will be given out on Friday and handed in the following Thursday. For English this term, we will be making use of grammar and spelling sheets to reinforce work in this area. Children will have a textbook to help them.

Children will also be given a maths workbook and directed to specific pages each week. Alongside this, the children will be given maths text books which are useful as revision aids. Children will be shown how to use these effectively however if they have any difficulty, they can ask for support on Wednesday lunchtimes.
