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Welcome back to the Summer Term! Hopefully you all managed a well-earned break over the Easter holidays and managed to enjoy the glimpses of sunshine that we had. This letter will give you key information about the Summer Term and information on how to keep up to date with your children's work.







We are beginning the term with a Science topic on Earth Science: Seasonal Changes, focusing on the movement of the Earth and how seasons are created, before beginning our Plants topic. Alongside this, we will focus on History, in particular at the History of Communication. We have begun by looking at how people have communicated over the years and will narrow this down to the invention of phones and the impact these have had. We will then move onto our Geography unit looking again at the seasons but with more of a focus on how these seasons differ across the world.

Mathematics and English lessons will take place daily. In maths, we will be focusing on: comparing weight and mass, revisiting time, place value to 100, fractions for half and quarter, position and direction, 2D and 3D shapes, addition, subtraction and problem solving. Alongside this, daily Phonics and Reading sessions will take place which will build the children 's confidence with sounding out and blending in readiness for the Year 1 phonics screening check in June. In addition to our daily phonics lessons, we will have weekly spelling lessons which will cover the Year 1 spelling objectives.

I am so proud with how well the children have taken to the first swimming lesson, all having a go and showing great courage. We have just had parents' evening and reports will go out to parents at the end of the summer term but please, if you have any worries or concerns in the meantime, don't hesitate to contact me via the office or through the class email.
